

### Next on List needing donations:


Re-Leveling/updating the "Salzburger Haus" foundation requires funds, material, time and talent.

# DOCUMENTARY FILM ON FOUNDING EBENEZER

The documentary shot by Visual Methods started on Thursday July 21 and ended on Saturday July 23rd as part of the series "Saving Grace" on GPBS. Not sure about air time. I think the founding of Ebenezer story will comprise approximately 2 and \_ minutes. The story will try to be as historically accurate as possible to depict the founding of the colony. Professional actors carried the main parts (Oglethorpe, Boltzius, Salzburger woman) with the Georgia Salzburger Society and Jerusalem Church people acting as extras wearing clothing as close as possible to historical references and what was available. (The part played as the singing Salzburger woman is a Zoller and may be related). Material from Von Reck, Boltzius and the detailed reports were forwarded to the Director for use and guidance. The film is too for other historical information. The footage was shot on the property around Jerusalem and along the river bank to represent founding the new settlement of Ebenezer for the congregation formed at St. Anna in Augsburg, Germany, then the move to New Ebenezer all blended together. An outstanding opp ortunity using our "exile hymn" in the shoot was capitalized upon by the director Brad.


My part was Gronau, the assistant pastor to Boltzius. Working with the cast was very easy and casual, plus they were very concerned about actual history. This is be very important to us helping to get our story out more publicly. Especially after the effort this year to put the history of Ebenezer back in our Georgia Social Studies teaching standards. Hopefully, we are vigilant to not let this occur again.

Since there was only a few weeks' notice, it turned out pretty good looking from the inside, but the proof is in the pudding and will have to wait on the release.

# PURRYSBURG AND EBENEZER RELATIONSHIP

Dr Migiliazzo is Professor of History at Whitworth College in Spokane, Washington, where he has also served as Department Chair and Director of Faculty Development. He is a former Fulbright/Hays Scholar in American Studies and the editor of " Teaching as an Act of Faith: Theory and Practice in Church-Related Education " and " Lands of True and Certain Bounty: The Geographical and Colonization Strategies of Jean Pierre Purry ".

Dr Migliazzo's described his fascination

with Purry and colonization of Purrysburg Township two years before Ebenezer as the theme for "To Make This Land Our Own: Community, Identity, and Cultural Adaptation in Purrysburg Township, South Carolina, 1732-1865 ". He mentioned several of our ancestor's families that come from Purrysburg and tended to move back and forth. Some of this depended on getting the answer they wanted from the leaders they desired – much like people today. Ebenezer and Purrysburg shared much since they were both conversed in German. This included much trade, etc. The book is available at University of South Carolina Press.
