
for this to be your #1 thing to do next year. The old Salzburger farm house is worth taking a tour of, along with seeing the fabulous

- The Society continues to focus on cleanup and repairs on the old Salzburger House, the Fail House. Richard Loper (chair) and active GSS Board member, Larry Bradham, have organized pressure washing of the old house and kitchen. Because of the condition of the shingles, care was taken when pressure washing the roof.
- Price quotes are being sought from qualified preservation specialists for other projects, such as the stabilizing or replacement of the old damaged footings.
- The grounds occasionally need extra attention due to the hurricane and tropical storm season. Hurricane Michael did not cause any damage to the buildings or grounds, but with the great cooperative efforts of GSS and the church, Harold Schwanebeck and others cleared away fallen and broken limbs left hanging by the winds. Thanks to all who help keep Ebenezer safe and looking good.

Oom-pah-pa! Oom-pah-pa! The lively strains of authentic German music





