The Georgia Salzburger Society is proud to announce that the Heritage Day Festival for 2021 will be held on Labor Day, Monday, September 6th.

This year we will again feature booths, historic displays and reenactments, children's activities, food, and a speaker. The Market Platz and lemonade barrel will also return.

Our speaker will be Professor **Margarete Froelicher-Grundmann** who has been a friend of the Salzburger Society for many years and who has researched Salzburger history for about 25 years. She will speak on the connections between the Salzburgers of Ebenezer and the English and Germans living in Savannah during colonial times. She will also touch upon the influence of the Salzburgers on early Savannah and on the colony of Georgia.

On Saturday preceding, Labor Day kayak tours of Ebenezer Creek will be available through Backwater Expeditions. Also on Saturday, there will be a guided tour in Savannah of historic sites with German/Salzburger connections or significance. The tour will be led by GSS member and professional tour guide, Corbina Ike. Also on Saturday, a workshop will be held at 2:00 p.m. in the Board Room of the parsonage on researching your Georgia Salzburger ancestry.



On Sunday, there will be a concert at 3:00 p.m. at the church followed by a low country boil in the social hall. The meal will be catered by The ShellHouse Restaurant.

Researching Your Georgia Salzburger Heritage

A genealogy workshop, Researching Your Georgia Salzburger Heritage, will be held on Saturday, September 4th at 2 p.m. in the Seckinger Board Room in the parsonage.

Presented by Salzburger Heritage Research Committee Chair, Erika Bragg, this one-hour workshop is ideal for beginning or intermediate researchers.

Attendees will learn:

- how to identify their Georgia Salzburger ancestors.
- how to build a family tree using primary documents.
- to focus on maternal lines, a portion of heritage occasionally overlooked.
- to research using the sources available in the Loest Research Library.
- to research using reputable online sources.
- about GSS memberships and supplemental memberships.

THE GSS BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE REPORT

The GSS Buildings and Grounds Committee members have identified several important repair and restoration projects:



- The parsonage shingles need to be replaced. They are about 25 years old and are showing their age. The committee has obtained several estimates to replace the shingles and any rotten wood or fascia boards. Approximately \$9,500 will be needed to complete this important project.
- The parsonage air conditioner dates back to 1996 and is not as energy efficient as it used to be as reflected in the most recent power bills. The current unit is undersized for the building it is serving and is not operating efficiently.
- The next phase of restoration for the old Salzburger Fail House will include replacing some of the windows and any wood framing around them. The header beam on the front porch of the house has been damaged by carpenter bees and woodpeckers and needs to be replaced.



The committee members are dedicated to securing the best estimates from qualified contractors. Even so, these repairs will all have big price tags. GSS members are encouraged to donate to make these vital repairs and restorations a reality.

In order to accommodate the extra researchers in town for the Heritage Day Festival, the Loest Research Library and museum will be open:

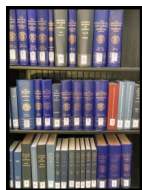
- Saturday, September 4 at 1 p.m. – 5 p.m.

The Marketplatz

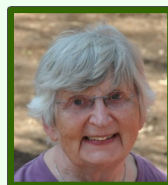

Speaker: Margarete Froelicher-Grundmann



Margarete Froelicher-Grundmann is a native of Germany, received her education in Germany and studied at the Universities of Muenster and Tuebingen. She has taught German language and literature and the Cultures of the European Union at Armstrong Atlantic State University, now Georgia Southern University.

She has a keen interest in the history of the Salzburgers and has provided cultural and historical insights and lent her expertise in the transcription and translation of handwritten texts in the Old German script for our genealogical research.

She developed a teaching unit on the immigration and history of the Salzburgers for the American Association for Teachers of German. She also used her influence in the decision-making process of the Georgia Board of Education to keep the history and the achievements of the Salzburgers as part of the colonial Georgia history curriculum.

She will speak on the life of the Salzburgers in Ebenezer and their connections to Savannah, and on the heritage of other German-speaking settlers and their contributions to the development and advancement of the new colony and the city of Savannah.
