## Hurricane Helene Wreaks Havoc at Ebenezer


The fierce winds of Hurricane Helene have caused significant damage across the grounds of Ebenezer. Several large trees have fallen, one of which struck

the front corner of the Salzburger House, damaging the porch roof and flooring. Cleanup and repair efforts are already underway. Allen Kieffer and his work crew have completed a remarkable job of restoring the porch and roof of the Fail (Salzburger) House.

Josh Zeigler is focusing on the reconstruction of the demolished Syrup Shed and will provide further details soon. Plans are in motion to rebuild the shed with some improvements, including the addition of a wall to shield the syrup boiling process from river

### President's Message

We are still dealing with the damage from the hurricane/tornado that struck Ebenezer with damage to the Fail House, syrup shed, and numerous broken and damaged trees. Of course, Christmas is also upon us, ready or not.

Allen Kieffer of our Building and Grounds Committee has done a yeoman's job in repairing the damage to the porch of the Fail House. Allen and his helper have replaced much of the damaged flooring on the porch, rafters, and roofing slats. They have now also procured galvanized tin to replace the damaged portions of the porch roof. They have also stained the new rafters and slats, which are visible from below, and the remainder of the staining is to follow in the next few days.

Luckily, Allen has access to a small sawmill at his home and was able to saw up and salvage the larger pine tree trunks for use in the repairs. (A fine example of Salzburger ingenuity and recycling!)

We are also continuing to deal with the insurance carrier, Church Mutual, which provides the insurance coverage on the Church grounds and the Salzburger buildings. Hopefully, we will have a final figure from the insurance carrier in the next several days. Pending the final insurance quote we will commence a fund raising campaign for any repairs beyond that covered by insurance. We hope to deal with that in the coming days. Most of the trees have already been removed using Society funds but to be reimbursed by the insurance carrier.

Also, the Society was the subject of a continuing resolution in the Georgia Legislature made by the Speaker of the Georgia House of Representatives, Jon Burns. Another similar resolution was made by our Past President Anne Purcell in her capacity as Chair of the Georgia Department of Transportation. Quoting the resolution, it was resolved by Speaker Burns and the House of Representatives (Continued on page 4)

Dr. Thomas Müller-Bahlke's presentation on Heritage Day offered a fascinating insight into the institution that Boltzius referred to as "the blessed Halle orphanages." The presentation featured numerous visual aids, with the most striking being photographs of the buildings and holdings before their meticulous restoration.



Dr. Müller-Bahlke also detailed the founding of the Francke Foundations, including information about the Francke publications that have played a vital role throughout the centuries. The presses in Halle were instrumental in building the once substantial library of Ebenezer and provided Bibles for the town's residents.



### **Greetings Cousins!**

Many of you are very aware that our area had an uninvited guest last month by the name of Hurricane Helene. The grounds and some of the structures were damaged, and the job of cleanup and repairs is ongoing. While the Loest Research Library (LRL) received no structural damage, we lost our dehumidification system and are currently in the process of getting this rectified.

The LRL is constantly receiving books and other publications that are related to all things Salzburger. Recently, the library received a particularly welcome addition, and I'd like to share its significance and origin with you.

The Salzburger Society shares an important connection with an organization in Halle, Germany called the Francke Foundations. The director of the Francke Foundations is Dr. Müller-Bahlke, who was also the keynote speaker at the 2024 Heritage Day Festival in Ebenezer, GA. Dr. Müller-Bahlke provided much information regarding the early years of the emigration from the "Old Country" to the New World, including both here in Georgia and in Pennsylvania.

The books, entitled "Hallesche Pastoren in Pennsylvania, 1743-1825 (Halle Pastors in Pennsylvania, 1743-1825) is a valuable eight volume set of books that provides researchers with a greater understanding of the Francke Foundations-trained pastors, such as Martin Boltzius and Christian Gronau, and their influence on the lives of those who fled to America seeking a life free from Catholic oppression.

These important books provide details into the lives of the pastors that were sent from Halle to preach in Pennsylvania. It was Dr. Müller-Bahlke's initiation that allowed the Francke Foundations to gift these books to the LRL. The LRL is very happy to have these books and to have someone of Dr. Müller-Bahlke's stature as a

# Apdates on Aeidlinger and Gruber Lamilies

Greetings GSS members and friends,

I am very happy to share some exciting genealogy updates with you. The recent digitization of *Even More Palatine Families*, a monumental work by Henry Z. Jones,

Jr. and Lewis Bunker Rohrbach, revealed some very important information to help fill in the blanks of Neidlinger history.

### Waldburga Fischer Neidlinger

Johann Ulrich Neidlinger was included in this work. The paragraph about him stated that he married Waldburga Fischer, a daughter of Andreas Fischer, in Leipheim on April 21, 1750. The marriage record is a treasure, as it states, "the young couple will travel...to Eben-Ezer in Georgia in America." I checked the Leipheim church books and found, not only the marriage record of Ulrich and Waldburga, but also several other Fischer family records. Waldburga Fischer was born on November 28, 1722 to Andreas Fischer and his wife Angelica, née Zeiher. Andreas Fischer was a widower when he married Angelica Zeiher on February 3, 1721. Andreas Fischer was born January 21, 1686 to Michael and Waldburga Fischer in Leipheim.

A marginal note in the baptism registry gave Andreas's death date as August 25, 1756. Angelica Zeiher was born December 22, 1695 to Martin and Catharina Zeyer of Leipheim. A marginal note listed Angelica's death date as Christmas Day of 1729.



### Maria Kraer Gruber

A large contingent of Gruber descendants are GSS members, and it always amazes me when I meet Grubers who have just recently learned of their ancestry. My mother-in-law is one such Gruber, as we only learned of her heritage five years ago. Peter Kraer and Margaretha Grundtner were the parents of Maria Kraer, the wife of Peter Gruber. Here are some important dates to add to the maternal side (Kraer) of your Gruber family tree:

- Peter Kraer was baptized November 14, 1678 and Margaretha Grundtner was baptized December 31, 1684. Peter and Margaretha were married on February 7, 1702.

    - ♦ Maria August 12, 1704
    - ♦ Salome August 11, 1706
    - ♦ Martin May 21, 1708
- The widower Peter Kraer married secondly to Brigittae Aperger on October 23, 1709.

    - ♦ Magdala May 9, 1712
    - Johannes May 14, 1713
    - Martin May 14, 1713
- Again a widower, Peter married Barbara Rohrmoser on October
   19, 1715. Barbara was baptized December 5, 1696.

    - ♦ Catharina October 24, 1716
    - Gertrude February 25, 1719
    - ♦ Anna November 14, 1721
    - ♦ Barbara April 30, 1724
    - ♦ Rupert November 19, 1726
    - ♦ Anna August 9, 1729
    - ♦ Nicolaus October 7, 1732

Peter Kraer died January 24, 1748 in the town of his birth.
