President's Message

All hands have been on deck in preparation for the upcoming Heritage Day Festival and for the **Centennial Celebration** marking the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Georgia Salzburger Society (GSS). To commemorate this milestone, the Board of Directors placed a granite monument near the museum. The monument, shipped from the guarry in Elberton, Georgia, and supplied and installed by Oglethorpe Marble of Savannah, is of the same type and size typically used by the DAR to memorialize important locations from the American Revolution. The monument dedication will be Monday. September 1, 2025, at 10:45 AM, during the Festival. We encourage members and friends to contribute toward the cost of the memorial monument and its placement; all contributors will be acknowledged in the permanent records of the Society. Our fundraising goal of \$10,000 will cover the monument and inscription.

On Friday, August 29, 2025, the Society will host a Centennial Banquet at the New Ebenezer Retreat Center. All members, along with their families and guests, are invited to attend at a cost of \$25 per person — please RSVP (information on how to RSVP can be found in the second article on page 3). Special invitations are being sent to former GSS presidents.

Plans are also well underway for the **Heritage Day Festival**, which promises to be an excellent event featuring numerous vendors, demonstrations, displays, and activities. Special thanks go to the Heritage Day Chair, Vice President Erika Bragg, and to the Centennial Committee co-chairs, Museum Curator Patsy Zeigler and Past President Claudia Christiansen, and to all of our dedicated volunteers, especially Buildings and Grounds Chair Josh Zeigler and Allen Kieffer. 

Speaker. Triederike Lippold

Shaping Tomorrow: How the Francke Foundations Connect Heritage and Community

Founded over 300 years ago in the spirit of education, faith, and community, the Francke Foundations in Halle continue to build meaningful connections between history and the present day. Today, the Foundations support innovative projects that engage children, young people, families and adults with historical heritage—fostering creativity, scientific inquiry, and sustainable action. This presentation will highlight inspiring examples of how tradition and innovation go hand in hand. From student-led historical research to artistic interpretations of the past, the Francke Foundations bring history to life in dynamic, participatory ways. International collaborations are a vital part of this mission, including partnerships with a Lutheran congregation in southern Poland and the Museum for Intercultural Dialogue in Tharangambadi, South India. The presentation invites reflection on how the partnership with the Georgia Salzburger Society could grow in new directions by engaging in shared educational and cultural initiatives. Friederike Lippold holds master's degrees in Art History and Slavic Studies (with a focus on Russian and Polish). After spending ten years working in Central and Eastern Europe, she joined the Francke Foundations in 2004. Her international work initially focused on projects with Russian and Polish partners, a priority that shifted following the onset of the Russian invasion of Ukraine. In 2024, she visited partners in South India for the first time. In 2025, she will have the honor of participating in the Georgia Salzburger Society's Heritage Day for the first time, and she looks forward to engaging in dialogue and building connections around shared history and future cooperation. She is also a specialist in intercultural communication and currently heads the Digital Media Division within the Communications Department at the Francke Foundations. ~ Erika Bragg


